Parrilla Mexicana on SR 131. We ask you join us in supporting these, and many other, great local





Safety with Oily Rags (wet with flammable or combustible liquid)

Oil-based paints, stains, and varnishes are often used for home improvement projects. It is common to use rags to wipe up spills or clean brushes. But wet rags can ignite on their own. They can start a fire if not handled carefully. The same is true of the liquids themselves.

HOW CAN RAGS START A FIRE?

The oils commonly used in oil-Be aware that this does not happen



 Put dried rags in a metal container. Make sure the cover is tight. Fill the container with a water and detergent solution. This will break down the oils.

• Keep containers of oily rags in a cool place. Keep them out of direct sunlight. Keep them away from other heat sources. Check with your town for information on disposing of them.

based paints and stains release heat as they dry. If the heat is not released in the air, it builds up. That is why a pile of oily rags can be dangerous. As the rags dry, the heat is trapped. The heat builds up and finally causes a fire. with water-based finishes.

LIQUIDS THAT CAN CATCH FIRE

- Flammable and combustible liquids should not be used near an open flame. Do not smoke when working with these liquids.
- If you spill liquids on your clothing, remove your clothing and place it outside to dry. Once dry, clothing can be laundered.
- Keep liquids in their original containers. Keep them tightly capped or sealed. Never store the liquids in glass containers.

HOW CAN LIQUIDS START A FIRE?

Vapors from flammable and combustible liquids can ignite, causing a fire. There are many commonly used flammable liquids. Gasoline, lacquers, and nail polish are just a few examples. There are many commonly used combustible.

GASOLINE

- Use gasoline only as motor fuel. Never use it as a cleaner. Never use it to break down grease. Never bring gasoline indoors, even in small amounts.
- Store gasoline ONLY in a container that is sold for that purpose. Make sure the container is tightly capped when not in use. NEVER store gasoline containers in a basement or in the occupied space of a building. Keep them in an outbuilding, a detached garage, or a shed outdoors.

RAGS WET WITH PAINT AND STAIN

- Never leave cleaning rags in a pile. At the end of the day, take the rags outside to dry.
- Hang the rags outside or spread them on the ground. Weigh them down. Do this so they do not blow away. Make


New Technical Rescue Vehicle Arrives to Serve the Township

chassis. This vehicle replaces two older vehicles that were in the fleet, a 1977 Grumman support vehicle and a 1993 GMC Sierra utility truck. By consolidating two vehicles into one, we had the ability to customize the configuration of a vehicle that would be better suited to support our special rescue operations and that will serve the Township efficiently for many years to come.



New to Miami Township: Greenacres Water Quality Education Center

New to Miami Township in 2017: The Greenacres Water Quality Education Center located at 6040 Price Road in Miami Township. This facility, which opened in March of 2017, is designed as a combination field station/ classroom for students to study the natural world through inquiry-based observation and experimentation using the same technologies professionals use. Uniquely located on the confluence of an urban and forested stream, the center giving students a first-hand look at the impacts human activities have on water quality. The goal of the Water Quality Education Center is to foster curiosity, nurture creative problem-solving, cultivate critical thinking and inspire innovation. The Center contains high

end chemistry and biology classrooms in a field setting so students can test physical, chemical, and biological water quality parameters and conduct student-driven project-based research on innovative solutions to current water problems. Lessons taught at the Center will follow the STEMs (Science, Technology, Education and Math) model in life and physical sciences which blends academics into a career-themed curriculum that provides students with real-world experiences, while meeting Ohio's Academic standards for grades 4-12.



Greenacres was founded in 1988 as a 501(c)(3) private operating foundation by Louis and Louise Nippert. Greenacres reflects the style and grace of Louis and Louise Nippert who operated Greenacres as a mid-twentieth century farm from 1948 to 2012. The mission of Greenacres is:

- To preserve for the public an area reflecting the traditional environment and its historical significance.



Storm Ditch & Pipe Maintenance

Many people are not aware that it is the property owners' responsibility rather than the county's or township's responsibility to maintain storm

ditches or pipes on their property. Here are some things you can do to prevent drainage problems:

- Keep open drainage channels clear of yard waste and other debris. These materials can get washed downstream and cause blockages that result in flooding problems.
- Keep street gutters, catch basins, and storm drain inlets clear of debris. Clear these on a regular basis.
- If permitted, disconnect roof drains from storm sewers. Allowing these to empty onto open ground slows the water and allows some of it to infiltrate.

- Alternatively, purchase a "rain barrel" and allow roof drains to empty into these. This water in turn could be used to water your lawn or garden. Rain barrels have overflows that allow excess water to pass through during big storms.
- If at all possible, maintain open drainage channels rather than installing pipe. Open channels slow water and allow infiltration, while pipes eliminate infiltration and rush water downstream. Plus they are easier and cheaper to maintain.

Individual homeowners can do quite a bit to help protect our streams. While it may not seem like much, small contributions from a large number of people will go a long way toward improving stream quality. Here are some things you can do to help:

• Never dump anything down the storm drain. If you don't know how to properly dispose of a material, call the Storm Water District for guidance.

- Sweep up driveways, sidewalks and gutters after mowing the lawn. Grass clippings and other yard waste contribute nutrients a major pollutant of Clermont County streams.
- Vegetate bare spots in your yard to reduce erosion.
- Keep trees and shrubs that border streams in place. These help prevent erosion and filter pollutants much better than grass turf.
- Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly. Test your soil first to see what it needs.
- Maintain your car. Check for leaks. Properly dispose of used automotive fluids.
 - Pick up after your pet.
- Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly.
